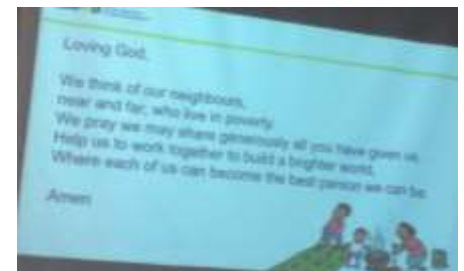


# Harvest 2019
