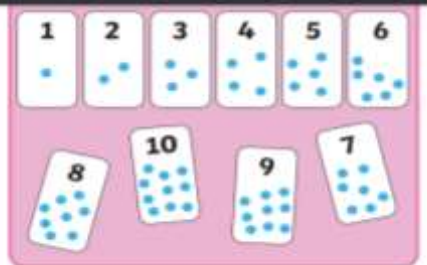
English	Maths	RE
<p>Continue to practise blending words and sentences. Play games online and at home to help with this.</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCo7fbLgY2oA_cFCIg9GdxtQ The above link will take you to a daily Read Write Inc lesson. You can choose which sounds you would like to focus on (choose ones that you are unsure of) and the teacher will guide you through reading, writing and recognizing the sound.</p>	<p>Use doodle maths each day. I have set tasks for you to do, as well as the practise games that you already use. Our focus for this half term is accurate counting and ordering of numbers to 20. This will enable us to double, halve and share.</p>	<p>Don't forget that mass is live streamed each Sunday.</p> <p>Continue practicing saying the 'Hail Mary' and 'Our Father' at bedtime.</p> <p>Prayer ideas are on our school website. <i>school website</i> → <i>Covid-19 update</i> → <i>practical prayer guides</i></p> <p>Continue to practise learning and saying the Our Father prayer.</p>
<p>Using the Oak Tree Academy website https://www.thenational.academy/. Under schedule, click onto Reception and then Week 9. In literacy follow the daily lessons. These will start with a phonics input each day and will then build on these skills as follows: Day 1: What is a reptile? How many reptiles do we know? Day 2: Listen to the story 'The Crocodile Who Didn't Like Water'. Answer questions about the story, justifying your answers with the word 'because'. Day 3: Draw a story map of 'The Crocodile Who Didn't Like Water'. Day 4: Research and record what your favourite reptile is. Day 5: Make a fact file of your favourite reptile/s.</p>	<p>Use Purplemash to access maths city and play number recognition and counting games. Could you therefore practise the following with your child:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Making the sign of the cross accurately. • Saying the Hail Mary accurately. • Recognising the Holy Family. • Recognising and naming the Bible. • Reciting (briefly) a Bible story. • Remembering the Nativity story.

I will definitely be there in September to say hello and to help you to settle into your new class and to help your new teacher to get to know you. around the drawing write some sentences/captions about yourself. You may include; what you enjoyed best in Reception class, what your favourite subject is, who are your friends, what do you like to do at home, what is your favourite book? Whilst writing remember:

- Can you use interesting connectives and wow words?
- Can you remember punctuation (capital letter, finger spaces, full stops?)
- Can you sound out a simple word/sentence using phonic knowledge?

*This is a repeat activity as none of these have been emailed/sent to me. If you could complete this activity and I will save them for the children's new teacher. Also, please write a letter to your year 6 buddy that I can also forward on to them. Thank you!

Read lots! Use your own books, audio books or the books on PurpleMash.



- With your grown-up, write the numbers 1 through to 20 on pieces of paper.
- Can you draw dots on each card to match the number?
- Ask your grown-up to hide the cards.
- Can you find all 20 cards?
- Can you make a number line by putting the cards in order?
- Start with the number 1. Which number comes next?

It will be fun working way through all of the fun things in your jar, at a later date.

Think of two things that make you happy, sad, angry, scared. Draw a picture of each.

Remember Jesus is with you through all of these emotions and you can call on Him to help you. Write thank you Jesus beneath your drawings and say a prayer of thanks.



- Gather a set of plastic bottles.

Ask a grown-up to help you write down the 7 days of the week. Try solving some problems based on the days of the week, such as, 'Today is Tuesday. Yesterday, Billy Bear went to the beach. What day did he go to the beach?' or 'Today is Thursday. Tomorrow, Katie Koala is going swimming. What day is she going swimming?' Try making up some questions of your own too. Can you solve these season problems? Draw a picture of your answers.
