Check they have worked out what half of each of these numbers is correctly. | Caring for one another: Help each other be worry wise. We all have worries at one time or another in life. Worry can be "worth it worry" → this leads to positive action or "worthless worry" → provides nothing but hindrance. Make a happy box/ container to deposit your worries/concerns into. Your child might be able to do all of the activities independently or they might need differing levels of support. Use your discretion). | Multiplication assessment: Complete the 2do set. Count in sets of 2,3, 4,5, 6, 8 and 10 starting from different numbers up to 50. Draw simple pictures or get out small objects and group them, if that helps. Each day write your 2, 5 or 10 times tables out so you know them fluently by the end of term. If you do know them already work on 3,4,6 and 8 times tables. | Mates matter! What subtraction sums can you derive from the addition sums? | Develop fruity thinking: fruit is good for physical health, fruity thinking is good for mental health!
