Challenges

- Repeat your table in the evening. How much have temperatures changed?
- Look at the forecast of your location for the whole day. Create a line graph showing the temperature.

Why is it good to receive a gift from somebody?

What does it say about the way that person thinks of you?

Why is it good to give to other people? What does it say about the way in which we respect and care for them?
