<p>Continue to practise blending words and sentences. Play games online and at home to help with this.</p> <p>This week will revisit the sounds taught so far and practise using them in words and sentences. The following games may help you:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • PhonicsPlay games online. • On differing squares of paper write different sounds. Turn one over, say the sound and write down a word containing it. Can you put this word into a sentence? • Play I spy. • Choose a sound and find an object beginning with that sound. 	<p>Use doodle maths each day. I have set tasks for you to do, as well as the practise games that you already use. Our focus for this half term is accurate counting and ordering of numbers to 20. This will enable us to double, halve and share.</p>	<p>Don't forget that mass is live streamed each Sunday.</p> <p>Continue practicing saying the 'Hail Mary' and 'Our Father' at bedtime.</p> <p>Prayer ideas are on our school website. <i>school website</i> → Covid-19 update → practical prayer guides</p> <p>Continue to practise learning and saying the Our Father prayer.</p>
<p>Using the Oak Tree Academy website https://www.thenational.academy/. Under schedule, click onto Reception and then Week 5 . In literacy follow the daily lessons. These will start with a phonics input each day and will then build on these skills as follows:</p> <p>Day 1: Follow the instructions for planting a seed. You will need seeds or fruit pips, soil, a pot and water! Write instructions for someone else to read.</p> <p>Day 2: Listen to the story 'Jack and the Beanstalk'. Design and make beanstalk.</p> <p>Day 3: Write/draw a story map for 'Jack and the Beanstalk'.</p> <p>Day 4: Write the story (beginning and middle)</p> <p>Day 5: Write the story (ending and proof read.)</p>	<p>Use Purplemash to access maths city and play number recognition and counting games. Read lots! Use your own books, audio books or the books on PurpleMash.	<p>Counting</p> <p>Practise counting accurately up to 20. Count natural objects in your garden or sweets etc. Can you write numbers to 20 on a large sheet of paper and then count your objects on top of number, checking that you have the correct amount? Ask a grown up to cover some of your numbers and see if you can work out which numbers have been covered.</p>	Draw a picture or write a prayer of thanks to the essential/key workers. Discuss what the NHS stands for and who the other key/essential workers are.
<p>Complete the activities set in 2do on purplemash. Remember you can read or hear the instructions for these activities by pressing the green triangle button.</p> <p>Remember to keep in touch, using our class blog on Purplemash.</p>	<p>Ordering Numbers</p> <p>Ask a grown up to write numbers to twenty onto separate pieces of paper and see if you can order them correctly. Can you count up and down the number line?</p> <p>Ask a grown up to give you addition and subtraction problems and use your number line to help you to solve them e.g. what is 7-4?</p>	<p>Mindful May activity:</p> <p>Are there any elderly people living in your St? Are they alone? How may they be feeling at the moment? Say a prayer for them and if you can, draw them a picture to cheer them up and post it through their door.</p>
