These figures are based on **152** responses to the survey. We were unable to include statistics of when parents did not indicate a definite response but ticked across two responses for the same question.

We are delighted and reassured by the encouraging, positive responses received, confirming the support, value and partnership we share with parents. The safety, happiness and well-being of each child is our main priority; when these are firmly secure, successful learning takes place. Setting the right amount and quality of homework is probably the hardest thing of all for schools to get right for families. It is unclear from raw data whether the very small minority of parents who disagree with the amount of homework set believe we set too much or too little. Many families highly value homework and have the time and space to support it, but we also understand that others find homework challenging with their children. We understand that many of our children lead busy lives out of school engaged in a whole variety of sports, clubs and activities. Getting the tone of homework just right for everyone is almost impossible, so please talk to your child's teacher if you have any concerns. We would urge and encourage, however, that you read every day with your children, regardless of their age, ability and stage of reading development.
